## Chart 1 Tener + que + infinitive

I have to study	We have to write

#### Chart 2 Informal Affirmative Commands

Below is the method for forming commands in which you tell someone that you speak to informally what to do. This method is only for people that you would address as "tú". It must be one person. The command must be affirmative (to do something).

Regular -ar verbs	
Use the present tense form of the verb that you would use for él, ella. or Ud. It should be the same as the present tense tú form without the "s".	
Regular -er verbs	
Use the present tense form of the verb that you would use for él, ella. or Ud. It should be the same as the present tense tú form without the "s".	
Regular -ir verbs	
Use the present tense form of the verb that you would use for él, ella. or Ud. It should be the same as the present tense tú form without the "s".	
Irregular commands	
Hacer Poner Tener	

### Chart 3 Present Progressive

The present progressive is used to express what someone is doing in that moment (right now). It requires two parts. You must use a conjugated form of estar and a present participle.

To form the present participle for verbs ending in -ar, remove the -ar and add <b>-ando</b> .	
To form the present participle for verbs ending in -er, remove the -er and add <b>-iendo</b> .	
To form the present participle for verbs ending in -ir, remove the -ir and add <b>-iendo</b> .	

Conjugate estar in the present tense and add the present participle to form the present progressive.

I am listening	We are visiting
You are eating	You (plural, informal in Spain) are drinking
He/She/You (formal) are living	They/You (plural) are writing
